Regional Partnership Risk Register Committee Recommendations

The Regional Partnership reviewed two risks from the Risk Register 1. Decreasing engagement of congregation members and 2. Not engaging in and growing mission. The Committee discussed the current controls, practices, and activities we are currently doing and if they are having an effect on those risks.

Devin North, Risk & Internal Audit Manager, Synod Mission Services joined the meeting to support the conversation and provided helpful insight on ways the committee could reflect, track and measure risks.

The Committee are committed to reviewing one or two risks at every monthly meeting and Devin has agreed to join the meeting to assist in the ongoing Risk conversation.

Growth Fund Proposal Alstonville and Byron Shire (FNC)

On 24 September, the Growth Fund application for Alstonville and Ballina Byron will be processed by the Growth Fund Committee. Daniel Yang, Phil Dokmanovic and Peter Worland will be in attendance for that conversation and we are hopeful for a successful outcome.

Opening of Lismore Regional Uniting Church

The opening of Lismore Regional Uniting Church is taking place on Sunday, 22 September. We rejoice with Lismore after the horrendous floods in 2022 which inflicted double the damage of the 2017 floods.
